Spending the grant: DfE guidance

The DfE spokesperson said that schools are free to decide how to spend the grant, but they must be able to show that their spending has led to a “direct and sustained” improvement in sporting provision.

The guidance from the DfE and EFA, linked to above, says that schools should use the funding to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities they already offer
- Make improvements that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Schools ... must be able to show that their spending has led to a "direct and sustained" improvement in sporting provision

Suggested uses include:

- Hiring qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- Providing teachers with resources and training in PE and sport
- Running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs to support the least active children
- Running sports activities with other schools

The guidance also specifies that the grant should not be spent on:

- Employing specialist coaches or teachers to cover planning, preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements, as PPA should be covered by core staffing budgets
- Teaching the minimum requirements of the national curriculum, including swimming
