

Shared reading - Storytime - sharing a love of reading, modelling reading aloud, becoming immersed in texts


Topic lessons, writing sessions, assemblies

Sequence the key events in the story.




Storytime




Storytime is important because it significantly aids in a child's development, fostering language and literacy skills, boosting cognitive abilities like memory and focus, nurturing creativity and imagination, building vocabulary, and strengthening the emotional bond between a child and the reader. It also exposes children to new concepts, helps them understand different viewpoints, and encourages a lifelong love of reading.
