Funding request from the school to make use of PTA funds

The school has put in a funding request of c. £3,000 - £4,000 of PTA funds to buy a class set and trolley of Chromebooks for the whole school and have shared the following information: in support-

"We are requesting the Chromebooks to improve the teaching of computing at Barns Green and ensure children are more prepared for secondary school and the wider world. Currently, we only have 6 laptops for the children at Barns Green and a set of iPads. All teachers would love to have more computers to enhance the computing curriculum. We want to keep up to date with the using current technology and best support our children for the future. We feel that having Chromebooks and our iPads would ensure children had the opportunity to use a wide range of technology and experience the differences between a tablet and Chromebook, using PowerPoint and documents for example. We also feel that funding for this would benefit more child led learning in other subject areas across the entire school. We would love funding from the PTA as it would benefit all children and all staff."

If approved by the PTA, the Chromebooks would be funded by existing PTA funds and monies raised from the summer fete.
